REMEMBERING THE POSITIVE MESSAGE OF COLUMBUS

In the near future, since it has 52 co-sponsors and bipartisan support, the U.S. Senate will be considering a bill that is currently in the Judiciary Committee – S.4019. Unfortunately, that bill comes with a proposed amendment by Senators Ron Johnson (R., Wis.) and James Lankford (R., Okla.) that would remove Columbus Day as a Federal holiday. Of course, the Knights successfully lobbied for an annual Columbus Day proclamation in 1934, with it becoming a Federal holiday in 1968.

In 1882, when Father McGivney proposed "the Sons of Columbus" to a room of men named Carroll, Colwell, Driscoll, Geary, Healy, Kerrigan, McMahon., Mullen and O'Connor, it was because Columbus was a positive symbol of patriotism and unity. "In the climate of the 1880s, the name Columbus affirmed that the New Haven organization would be loyal to the United States; that was a constant, if unfounded, point of suspicion where Catholics were concerned. At the same time, it would encourage Catholics of all nationalities to join ... Assimilating them was Bishop McMahon's most pressing challenge. Even as he fought to dispel the idea that Connecticut Catholicism was Irish Catholicism ..."

"In a society dominated by Protestant money and power, immigrant Catholics found strength and solace in their religion. At the same time, they were eager to fit in. Not only did they need to prove that they had severed political ties with their homelands, but they also wanted to confirm that they were really American." Invoking Columbus meant, "not only was there a place for Catholics and immigrants within American society, but that such a person had already played a part in creating the young, free world around them."

Removing Columbianism from the national consciousness now, with its timely and positive message of unity and patriotism, seems like a mistake.

P.S. We can all be thankful that Father McGivney did not stick with the first fraternal organization that he inherited at St. Mary's, the St. Joseph's Young Men's Total Abstinence and Literary Society. The Order's social events would be very different.
