**PATRICK E. KELLY – THE NEW SUPREME KNIGHT**

We are now two months into Patrick Kelly’s tenure as the 14th Supreme Knight of the Order. His term started on March 1, 2021. Mr. Kelly joined the Knights of Columbus through the college council at Marquette University in 1983. He obtained a master’s in theology from Catholic University and a law degree from Marquette. He has worked for the Knights since 2006 in public policy and executive director roles, joined the Knights of Columbus’ board of directors in 2013, and served as the Deputy Supreme Knight since 2017 before being elected to the Supreme Knight position. Before that, Mr. Kelly worked for the U.S. House of Representatives (committee on intelligence), the U.S. Department of Justice, and the U.S. Department of State (Ambassador-at-Large for International Religious Freedom). He also served in the U.S. Navy (JAG Corps) for 24-years, retiring as a Captain in the reserves.

He is continuing the Knights’ commitment to charity. Last month, the Knights donated \$146,000 to the Archdiocese of Piura, Peru to assist indigenous people in the Amazon suffering from COVID-19. In the past, Mr. Kelly has been very involved in right to life public policy issues (both with the Knights and serving on the board of the National Catholic Bioethics Center) and the March For Life in Washington, D.C. – so those initiatives will likely continue as priorities during his term.

Seminarian Stephen Rooney is completing his third year of Theological studies at Saint Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, New York. Last year he completed his Pastoral Year at Huntington's Saint Patrick's Parish. ### **MEMORIAL DAY**



Again, this year, Covid 19 will take its toll on our country's celebration of Memorial Day. Decoration Day, as it was originally known, was begun in various locations throughout the United States after the Civil War. With over 600,000 deaths from both sides in the war, people clamored to be sure that their lives were not forgotten. Over the years, in the spring, communities commemorated the fallen soldiers with solemn parades, and they decorated their graves with

flowers. Gradually people began to refer to the celebration as Memorial Day and in 1967, Congress officially declared the holiday to be Memorial Day. 1971 saw the last Monday in May designated as the official date of Memorial Day.

Many Memorial Day traditions have developed of the years, including the adoption of the red poppy as its commemorative flower; flying our flag at half -staff until noon, then raising it to full-staff for the remainder of the day; and the National Memorial Day Concert at the Capitol. Bellmore Council has marched in a Memorial Day parade since its inception. In past years the council alternated between the Bellmore and North Bellmore parades and happily joined the recent joint parade between the two communities. Some years we have been led by the Fourth Degree Color Corps and for many years we marched to the New York City Transit Police War Pipe Band. After the parade participants and their families joined together for hot dogs at our council home.

While we might not be marching again this year's parade because of Covid, all are asked to remember and pray for all those brave individuals who have died to protect the rights we enjoy as citizens of our great country.


