This will be my final letter to you as Grand Knight. I would like to say that it was a pleasure and an honor to be your Grand Knight for two terms and appreciate your confidence in providing me with this opportunity. I would like to thank all of my fellow officers who worked with me and

were instrumental in getting some new initiatives started and completed as well as providing me with opinions as we molded these new programs. I also need to thank my confidants who were a great source of ideas and frank opinions when we were working out issues and those new programs I mentioned above. It is priceless to have people that can be trusted to listen and provide honest and well thought out suggestions and or rebuttals to my thoughts so that no problems were created. I wish President Trump had good confidants but alas that is Washington D.C. where few can be trusted.

I am proud to say that this group of officers were involved in providing our Council with the following new or modified programs:

1. We have spent hours hammering out our new Council By-Laws with many starts and stops due to the changes imparted by Supreme. The new By-Laws were officially approved on Monday, April 20, 2020.

2. We are currently working on Resolutions that address Council specifics to the By-Laws and hopefully will be completed by May 31.

3. We started a program to either record or make our Social Nights available live to members who are unable to make our meetings in person. We made one attempt but then the lockdown started and we haven't had a meeting since. However, your officers have been meeting via Zoom while working on the By-Laws and Resolutions. Stay tuned as this will be a good outreach program for our members.

4. We asked and received full cooperation from our volunteer event coordinators. The Council is only successful when we take responsibility for running those events for which we volunteer. The Grand Knight should not be the fallback position for all events. More enjoyment is garnered when more people are involved.

5. We changed some of our finances into interest bearing accounts

to help the Council's financial viability farther into the future.

6. Our Charitable donations have increased dramatically from our St. Jude Bicycle Ride each September. We collected and donated approximately \$17,000 for the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in 2019. The good thing about this event is that it is a community event with many of our neighbors and friends participating.

7. Through just plain luck, we are in the midst of new shrines being built in front of the Council courtesy of an Eagle Scout project. Keep an eye out for the additions.

While we had many successes, there was one thing with which we have had difficulty. Attracting new members has been troublesome and for that matter getting existing members to be active is also troublesome. Hopefully things will change and the Knights of Columbus will be looked upon as an organization with which men and women will want to be associated. I believe there is still a place for an altruistic organization such as ours.

I am writing this amidst the Covid-19 lockdown. We have had a number of drive-bys for members who have passed or are very ill. It was very gratifying to see the large numbers of our brothers and sisters that took time to come and show their support for those families in need of consolation. I have told those families that once this Covid-19 issue is over we will have a Mass and ceremony that was not possible during the quarantine. This period will be debated and discussed for years. It seems that new or conflicting data comes out daily and we are all confused and tired of this. Our Council had to cancel Irish Night and German Night to my disappointment and we are not sure how the summer season will be and whether or not there will be a Memorial Day parade or a Street Fair. We are still in good shape thanks to our practices and prudent decisions.

Thank you all again for your support in the new initiatives that I thought were important for our Council and to the Officers who helped bring them to fruition.

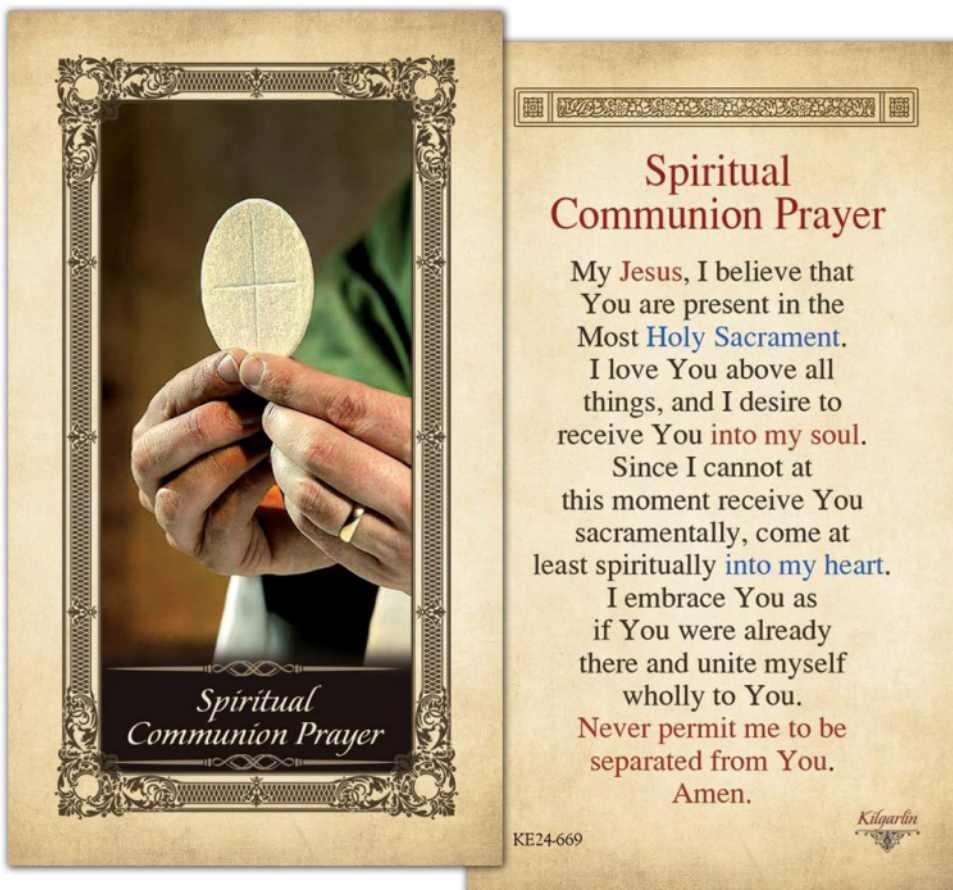
rescheduled.

Yes, ministry and life and general has very much changed.  
Regarding ministry it can be easy to simply take our foot off the gas.  
Rather, our Lord is calling us to pivot and hit the gas!



Thus, we are NOT closing shop. Rather, trying to be all things for all people.

We have the Church open 7 days a week. (It's a very big Church so it is very easy to maintain social distancing).

We have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament Sunday - Wednesday 12-6pm.

Although, all public liturgies have been suspended.

I assisted a couple of parishioners in making our parish the first parish in the diocese to have the Live-Stream Mass up.

We have updated this live-stream multiple time since. We have also uploaded all 4 mysteries of the rosary and the stations of the cross on our YouTube channel.

Each night I interview a priest in the rectory asking about his vocation story and his journey to the priesthood.

I am also still teaching the school children and public school children who are in our Faith Formation program via Zoom and Google Classroom.

I also call the families involved in youth ministry to check in on them.


